



Queensland World AIDS Day Regional Funding Grants

Queensland Positive People and Queensland Council of LGBTIQ Health, together with the Queensland World AIDS Day Alliance, are pleased to be calling for submissions for funding for World AIDS Day in regional Queensland for 2025. **There are limited number of grants available between \$200 and \$1,500.**

World AIDS Day raises awareness across the world and in the community about the issues surrounding HIV and AIDS. It is a day for people to show their support for people living with HIV and to commemorate people who have been lost to the epidemic.

World AIDS Day should always be informed by the lived experience. QPP and QC are committed to connection and partnership with the HIV positive voice. Projects and events should aspire to include people living with HIV, either by direct involvement or by consultation. We are looking for HIV leaders across Queensland, and to support education, awareness, and commemoration in their own communities.

All events and projects that raise awareness, offer remembrance opportunities, and promote support and HIV testing will be considered for funding.

We also provide funding opportunities for events and activities for **Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples**, communities, groups, and organisations every year connecting to World AIDS Day and HIV Awareness Week.

The national theme for World AIDS Day 2025 is “No one left behind”.

This theme reflects the urgent need to address persistent inequities in HIV prevention, testing, treatment, and quality of life — particularly for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, people from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds, and marginalised communities including those in regional and remote areas across Australia. It also acknowledges our global responsibility on World AIDS Day to advocate for the reinforcement of global commitments in humanitarian aid and development, which is vital to ensuring continued access to HIV services and healthcare worldwide for all.

The QWADA encourages applications up to \$400 for events held in house (for example: a World AIDS Day ribbon and information stall, or morning tea held at a health service) and up to \$1,500 for larger activities (for example: a community remembrance lunch/dinner) to maximise the impact of activities across Queensland.

Please note that we can support existing activities, that can turn into events that mark World AIDS Day, as well as new events and activities.

All events and activities should aim to be inclusive of all the diverse communities impacted by and at risk of HIV but can have a focus community or group. Events can be by RSVP only (for catering purposes etc) but must be promoted to the public so they can RSVP and attend.

Applications must be received to QPP via email wad@gpp.org.au, by COB Wednesday 5th November 2025. Early applications are encouraged.

Applications received earlier than the due date, may be approved prior if the committee deem appropriate. Late applications will always be considered, but funding is limited and can be challenging to support the events as much as usual.

Project Summary	Please provide a concise statement of your project (max 200 words). This should outline the project or event and detail the connection or involvement with the HIV positive voice.
Focus	Please list which groups (e.g., First Nations peoples, women, healthcare workers) your event is more focused on (if applicable)
Partners	Please list any partner organisations you will deliver the activities with.
Location and time	Please list specific location/s your activities will take place
Funding Request	Please list the amount of funding you are requesting for your project (single applications can be up to \$1,500). Limited funding is available.
Budget	Give an estimated budget should in dollar cost of the resources required for the whole project, including promotion. Where practical, you can show the dollar value of volunteer or in-kind contributions. Please note, regional grant funds cannot be used for regular staff wages or general expenses of organisations/services.

Outcomes	Briefly describe the outcomes of the project are the effects of the activities. Please briefly describe the outcomes of the activities you are proposing and describe the processes you will use to report and measure both the outputs and, ideally, the outcomes of your project.
Promotion	How will you promote the project or event. This can be through posters, or print advertising locally, using social media channels, or other methods.
Evaluation and measurement	Briefly describe how you plan to report and measure both the outputs and, ideally, the outcomes of your project. You can keep statistics, seek feedback from users, develop broad questionnaires, etc. These help us know how the event/activity went and provide feedback to stakeholders and the community.
Schedule	A timetable indicating the overall duration of the project and the timing of the significant stages and events. For stalls, just a start and end time is all we need.
Insurance	Please list the details of your Public Liability Insurance or provide your PLI Certificate.
